KANDIDATUR FÜR DEN SENAT 2025

The Senate election will then take place from Tuesday, January 21, 2025, 12:00 noon to Monday, January 27, 2025, also 12:00 noon as an online election. <u>More information</u>

What does the Senate do?

The Senate is the highest decision-making body of the university. It advises on matters of research, teaching and studies that are of fundamental importance to the university. Further tasks are set out in the Hessian Higher Education Act §42 and the HGU's Basic Regulations.

It consists of 17 members divided into four status groups:

- Professors have 9 seats,
- students have 3 seats,
- academic staff also have 3 seats,
- Finally, the administrative and technical staff have 2 seats.

The Senate is elected for two years at a time, while the students elect their members annually. The term of office of the new Senate begins on April 1, 2025.



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ANTIDISKRIMIERUNGSBEAUFTRAGTE DER HOCHSCHULE

Dear students,

I am pleased to introduce myself today as the university's Anti-Discrimination Officer. My aim is to work with you to create an environment in which all members of our university community can live and learn free from discrimination, prejudice and disadvantage.

What is discrimination?

Discrimination means that a person is disadvantaged or treated unequally on the basis of characteristics such as gender, ethnic origin, skin color, religion or belief, disability or chronic illness, age, sexual identity or physical appearance. According to the anti-discrimination guidelines of Hochschule Geisenheim University, discrimination includes the following forms:

1. direct disadvantage: Less favorable treatment compared to another person in a comparable situation on the basis of a particular characteristic.

2. indirect discrimination: Rules or procedures that appear to be neutral but may disadvantage per sons from certain groups.

3. harassment: Behavior that violates a person's dignity and creates an intimidating, hostile or humiliating environment.

4. sexualized harassment: sexually oriented behaviour that is unwanted and violates the dignity of the person concerned.

5. instruction to discriminate: A request to discriminate against a person based on a particular characteristic.

Why is awareness-raising important?

A non-discriminatory university culture requires the active participation of everyone. Raising awareness of discrimination helps us to recognize and challenge prejudices and promote respectful interaction. By continuously addressing these issues, we create an environment in which everyone can be equally successful. My role as an anti-discrimination officer

As an anti-discrimination officer, I am your point of contact for all questions and concerns relating to discrimination. My tasks include:

- Advice: support in reporting cases of discrimination and pointing out possible courses of action.
- Prevention: organizing awareness-raising events and any training courses.
- Mediation: Support in conflict resolution and cooperation with relevant bodies.

Study on climate change and mental health among students
